## BID RECOMMENDATIONS - DBE PARTICIPATION

Bid Protest on Contract # 30005 Restoration of Existing Gravity Sewer Mains Damaged by Hurricane Katrina by Excavation and Replacement from Manhole to Manhole, CIPP Lining from Manhole to Manhole and Point Repair at Various Sites throughout Orleans Parish

On Friday, December 20, 2013, five (5) bids were received for subject contract. The bid totals are as follows:

Fleming Construction Company, LLC	\$ 4,129,070.00
Wallace C. Drennan, Inc.	\$ 4,333,769.00
BLD Services, LLC	\$ 4,354,848.00
Boh Bros. Construction Co., LLC	\$ 4,847,791.00
Hard Rock Constructions, LLC	\$ 5,293,527.00

The estimated budget is \$5,000,000.00.

Thirty-six percent (36%) SLDBE participation was requested on this contract.

#### **Background**

The recent history of subject contract indicates that a mandatory pre-bid conference was held on Friday, December 6, 2013, at which SLDBE policies and procedures were explained to potential bidders. Fleming Construction Company, LLC; Wallace C. Drennan, Inc.; BLD Services, LLC; Boh Bros. Construction Co., LLC; and Hard Rock Constructions, LLC, were in attendance.

The apparent lowest bidder, Fleming Construction Company, LLC, submitted the following subcontractors:

**Hebert Trucking & Equipment Service** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$400,000.00 — 9.7%

**Cooper Contracting** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$500,000.00 — 12.1%

**Cabildo Staffing, LLC** (ineligible non-certified subcontractor) \$10,000.00 — 0.2%

**Dieudonne Enterprises, Inc.** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$250,000.00 — 6.1%

C & M Construction Group, Inc. (eligible certified SLDBE) \$20,000.00 — 0.5%

**Auguillard Construction Co., LLC** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$227,980.00 — 5.5%

Listed Subcontractors Participation totals:

\$1,417,980.00 — 34.3%

SLDBE Participation totals:

\$1,407,980.00 — 34.1%

Fleming Construction Company, LLC, failed to meet the 36% SLDBE Participation goal, or submit a documented Good Faith Effort with a notarized affidavit.

The apparent second lowest bidder, Wallace C. Drennan, Inc., submitted the following subcontractors:

**Auguillard Construction Co., LLC** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$500,000.00 — 11.5%

C & M Construction Group, Inc. (eligible certified SLDBE) \$290,000.00 — 6.7%

**Choice Supply Solutions, LLC** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$100,000.00 — 2.31%

**Cooper Contracting** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$290,000.00 — 6.7%

**Prince Dump Truck Service** (eligible certified SLDBE) \$450,000.00 — 10.4%

Participation totals: \$1,565,000.00 - 36.1%

Based upon analysis of SLDBE participation, the Economically Disadvantaged Business Program recommended that the SLDBE participation submitted by Fleming Construction Company, LLC, be rejected because the company failed to meet the DBE participation goal, did not provide documentation of Good Faith Effort by way of signed affidavit affixed with official seal and that the SLDBE participation submitted by Wallace C. Drennan, Inc., be approved.

On January 3, 2014 Fleming Construction Company, LLC, submitted a bid protest.

#### **Analysis of Bid Protest**

- 1) Protestor indicates that a typographical error occurred, "The actual dollar amount for the Sewerage & Water Board Contract 30005 should have read \$299,980, in lieu of incorrect amount of \$277,980."
- 2) Protestor indicates that "Several months ago Cabildo Staffing, LLC, a DOTD and City of New Orleans certified DMBE business, approached (Fleming Construction) as a certified State-Local Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. We incorrectly believed that they were also certified as DMBE by the Sewerage & Water Board and for that reason counted their participation toward the DBE goal."

In response, the SLDBE procedures and protocols, as outlined in the projects bid specification Section -09 <u>SETTING MINIMUM PARTICIPATION GOALS</u> states, "The stated minimum percentage DBE participation goal recommended by CRC and approved by the Board applies to the work of this contract....Should the Bidder fail to comply with this request, the bid shall be considered unresponsive, unless:

- A. An affidavit is furnished by the bidder with its bid showing that the DBE goals cannot be met for the following reasons... (2) The DBE offers made and accepted for subcontract and/or material supplies do not total the stated goal for participation, but total a lesser percentage, and (3) the bidder was unable to obtain DBE further participation, despite his or her demonstrated good faith efforts (as defined in Part III, D, 2 of the Board's DBE Plan) to obtain additional participation by DBE firms.
- B. Each of the assertions made by the bidder must be supported by documentary evidence.

In addition, the SLDBE procedures and protocols, as outlined in the projects bid specification Section -05 <u>UTILIZATION OF DBE VENDOR LISTINGS</u> states, "All bidders are required to utilize the most recent Sewerage & Water Board State-Local Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program Approved Vendor Listings for Construction, Goods & Services/Professional Services, in their selection of DBE entities to meet DBE participation goals"

## **Findings**

The initial analysis of the SLDBE participation submitted by Fleming Construction Company, LLC, found that Fleming Construction failed to meet the SLDBE participation goal, and did not provide documentation of Good Faith Effort by way of signed affidavit affixed with official seal. Within the protest

filed by Fleming Construction, they state, "Even with this rejection of Cabildo Staffing, Fleming's proposed DBE participation is still 35.8%"

After review and analysis of the DBE issues raised by Fleming Construction Co., LLC which form the basis of the bid protest, there are no compelling reasons which merit its support.

#### Recommendations

The Economically Disadvantaged Business Program recommends that the bid protest be denied. As such, the recommendation to reject the participation submitted by Fleming Construction Company, LLC, and accept the DBE participation submitted by Wallace C. Drennan, Inc., is reaffirmed.

Dr. Wright indicated she believed it was a good faith effort; however the proper paperwork to indicate the good faith effort was not submitted.

Mrs. Schornstein indicated that we need to follow the law because we could face litigation. The decision does not end with the Operations Committee it still has to go before the Board.

The recommendations on subject contract were accepted and approved by a motion of Mrs. Schornstein and seconded by Dr. Wright. The motion carried.

Based upon analysis of SLDBE participation, the Economically Disadvantaged Business Program recommended that the SLDBE participation submitted by Fleming Construction Company, LLC, be rejected because the company failed to meet the DBE participation goal, did not provide documentation

of Good Faith Effort by way of signed affidavit affixed with official seal and that the SLDBE participation submitted by Boh Bros. Construction Co., LLC, be approved.

On January 3, 2014 Fleming Construction Company, LLC, submitted a bid protest.

#### **Analysis of Bid Protest**

3) Protestor indicates that "Several months ago Cabildo Staffing, LLC, a DOTD and City of New Orleans certified DMBE business, approached (Fleming Construction) as a certified State-Local Disadvantaged Business Enterprise.
